

Grades 9th-12th Visual Art Audition Overview and Requirements

Before the Audition

Students will prepare a **portfolio** of their work to present at the audition. The high school portfolio should include at least 6 artworks using a minimum of 3 different mediums (ie, paint, pencil, marker, clay, etc.)

Some possible items to include in the high school portfolio are a portrait (people or animals), a landscape (places), an observational work (things), and 3 artworks of your choice.

Each work must include an Artist Statement attached. This statement should include what the piece is, how it was made, and the meaning/message/purpose of the artwork.

Portfolio Guidelines

- Students should present artwork neatly in a folder or portfolio bag.
- Students may include artworks created for school assignments or on their own within the last two years.
- Students may also choose to show any 3D artworks they have made jewelry, fibers, clay, found objects or metal
 - If a 3D work is too large or delicate to bring with you, you may include a photo of the work in your portfolio
- Students should not include drawings/tracings of copyrighted material (i.e., Disney or Anime characters)
- ALL artwork in the portfolio should be school appropriate (no depictions of nudity, weapons, violence, etc.)

During the Audition

Students will have 45 minutes to demonstrate technical and creative skills in a single composition.

- Mediums provided include: pencil, colored pencil, marker, and watercolor paint.
- All materials needed during the audition will be provided by the FWAFA Visual Arts department.
- Students will create a still life, observational drawing.
- Students will be asked to add to their still life, enhancing the artwork using their personal expression.
- Finally, students will write a short artist statement that includes what they made, how they made it, and/or the meaning of their artwork.

Evaluation - The student portfolio will be evaluated on technique, personal expression, preparation and variety of work. Students will be evaluated during the audition on their technical skill, creativity, artist statement, and their engagement/interest in the process.
